### PLEASE NOTE

**Classes 1 & 2 Pre-Novice Pony & Horse will jump their first round together. Riders eligible for the “Jump Off” will then be split Ponies/Horses. Two sets of rosettes, prize money and points. The same format will be used for classes 3&4, 5&6, 7&8 and 9A&B. Please state which section i.e. Class on entry form.**

### NOTES

1. Definition of “Pre-Novice” – class 1&2. If BOTH the rider and the horse have won a first rosette for jumping before 1/1/08, not necessarily as a combination, they will not be eligible. If only one or the other has won, they will be eligible. Winners may continue to enter as Pre-Novice for the remainder of the season and points will be accrued for the annual trophy.
2. Class 1 to 9, riders 4 years and over at 1/1/08
3. Definition of Novice – Classes 3 & 4 – combination of horse and rider must not have won more than three first rosettes in non-novice jumping classes before 1<sup>st</sup> January in the current year.
4. **Prize money will be given in all Show Jumping classes. 1<sup>st</sup> - £6, 2<sup>nd</sup> - £4, 3<sup>rd</sup> £2 (Adjusted if less than ten entries)**
5. Classes 5 & 6 are open to members and non members of WRC and 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> will qualify for the Allcomers Championship at the September Show provided that if they are not already a member of WRC, they join on the day of qualifying. Entrants only qualify once and if 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> prize winners have already qualified, then the qualification passes to the next placed rider. Prize money to be given 1<sup>st</sup> - £7, 2<sup>nd</sup> - £5, 3<sup>rd</sup> - £3 (Adjusted if less than 10 entries). Double prize money at the Championship.
6. **\*\*PRIZE MONEY MUST BE COLLECTED ON THE DAY\*\***
7. Mr Quickstep Trophy will be awarded to the junior riding a horse which attains the most points in this ring. Sponsored by Katie Meredith.
8. **SCORING. KNOCK DOWN – 4 FAULTS. 1<sup>ST</sup> STOP – 4 FAULTS. 2<sup>ND</sup> STOP – 8 FAULTS, 3<sup>RD</sup> STOP – ELIMINATION. FALL – ELIMINATION.**

11. Horse/Pony In Hand – Rosette for best 3yr or under. May be split Horses/Ponies if sufficient entries.

13. Young Handler. Handler 12 years or under 1/1/08.
14. Bonny Pony In Hand. Not to ex. 14.2hh
15. Pony The Judge Would Most Like To Take Home – In Hand. Rosette for the best tail.

1. Class 10 – to be shown in accordance with breed society rules.
2. Class 12 – Rosette for the best over 21 years old. May split according to age: 15 to 20 years and 21 years and over if sufficient entries. Please state age on entry form.
3. All Stallions and colts must be bitted and handled by an adult (17 years and over on 1/1/08) as stated in WRC Rules
4. All classes open to members and non members.
5. **Classes in this ring qualify for a separate overall trophy.**

## RING 3 – RIDDEN SHOWING – STARTS 9.30am

16. Ridden Coloured and Spotted.
17. Pony of Hunter Type – not ex 14hh, rider any age.
18. Pony of Hunter Type – ex 14hh and not ex 15hh, rider any age.
19. Ridden Hunter – ex 15hh
20. Veteran Horse or Pony – Ridden. 15yrs and over. Juniors may be led. See note 1.
21. Ridden Mountain & Moorland – any height (Inc. Haflingers) Juniors may be led. **NO SPURS**  
See Note 2.
22. Ridden Arabs – inc Anglo and Part Bred. Rosette for best Pure Bred, to be indicated on entry form.
23. Ridden Horse or Pony of Cob Type – may be split if sufficient entries.
24. Green Riding Horse / Pony – age 6 years and under. See Note 3.
25. Riding Horse – ex 14.2hh. See Note 4.

**ALL RIDERS 4 YEARS OR OVER 1/1/08 (INCLUDING LEAD REIN)**

**In all classes, the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> placings will ride off at the end of the day for the Ridden Showing Champion of the day. Members will receive points, to be accrued throughout the season. A Championship League Table will be kept separately.**

**The Annual Junior Showing Champion will receive a print of their horse/pony kindly sponsored by CANVAS 103.**

### NOTES

1. Class 20 – Rosette for best Over 21 year old. May be split according to age 15 to 20 and 21 and over if sufficient entries. Please state age on entry form.
2. Class 21 may be split if sufficient entries and at the Judges discretion. In this case, leading rein entries will be judged separately.
3. Class 24 – horse/pony not to have won a ridden showing class before 1/1/08. Winners may continue to enter this class for the remainder of the season. Horse to be ridden in snaffle bridle with cavesson, drop or flash noseband.
4. Class 25 – Rosette for best 15.2hh or under. May be split 14.2hh to 15.2hh and ex 15.2hh if sufficient entries.

- 26. Best Turned Out – Juniors and Seniors. Juniors may be led.**
- 27. Leading Rein Equitation – riders 8 years and under (can also enter class 31) See notes 1,3 and 4.**
- 28. Tots Equitation – riders 10 years and under. May NOT be led. See notes 1 & 3**
- 29. Novice Equitation – riders any age, may split Juniors and Seniors if sufficient entries. Please state age on entry form. See notes 1 & 2.**
- 30. Senior Open Equitation – riders 17 years and over. See note 3.**
- 31. Junior Open Equitation – riders 16 years and under. See note 3.  
At the June 8<sup>th</sup> Show, Charlotte Measures Trophy to be awarded to the highest placed member.**

**In classes 27 – 31, the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> placings will ride off for the Equitation Champion of the day. Members will receive points to be accrued throughout the season. A Championship League Table will be kept separately.**

**All riders 4 years and over 1/1/08 INCLUDING LEAD REIN.**

36. Working Hunter Pony – not ex 14hh. See note 4.

If only one or the other has won, they will be eligible. Winners may continue to enter as Novice for the remainder of the season and points will be accrued for the annual trophy.

In classes 36 – 39, all 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> placings will ride off at the end of the day for the Champion and Reserve Working Hunter of the Day who will then receive points to be accrued throughout the season for the Mr Lucky trophy. A Championship League Table will be kept separately.
4. Class 36 may be split, not ex 13hh and 14hh, if sufficient entries.

## WILMSLOW RIDING CLUB RULES

1. **At all WRC events, everybody mounted must wear protective headgear to at least PAS015 or EN1384 at all times. These hats must be worn with the harness properly adjusted and fastened.**
2. No rider will be permitted to enter *any class* unless correctly dressed, including hard hat, suitable footwear, jacket and light coloured jodhpurs.
3. It is the responsibility of each competitor to enter the ring when required for each class. If for any reason a competitor is unable to enter the ring when called, it is the responsibility of the competitor to inform the ring steward of the circumstances. Competitors leaving the ring whilst the class is in progress will only be allowed back at the discretion of the judge. Only real emergencies will be accepted as reason for disrupting a class.
4. Show entry fees will only be refunded in the event of a class being cancelled or upon receipt of medical or veterinary evidence.
5. **All stallions & colts must be bitted at all times and handled or ridden by an adult (17 years and over on 1/1/08).**
6. All events and classes are run under the guidance of the appropriate discipline's rules (eg British Riding Clubs, British Eventing, British Dressage, British Sports Horse Association (HIS), BSJA, BSPS, etc).
7. Membership cards must be carried at all times and must be shown to the judge in the ring to qualify for highest placed member rosettes. Lost cards will be replaced at the cost of 50p available from the Membership Secretary.
8. Any objection must be made in writing to the Secretary *within 30 minutes of the end of the class* together with £10. This will be returned if the objection is upheld.
9. Riders must keep to the designated working in areas and pedestrians to the designated walkways. Horses are not allowed in the vicinity of the Secretary's caravan. No galloping allowed and no unauthorised use of the cross country fences permitted, offenders will be required to leave the field and no refund made.
10. The Welfare Policy of WRC must be adhered to at all times and it is the responsibility of all competitors and owners to ensure that the welfare of their horse(s) or pony(ies) is given priority at all times on the showground.
11. No horse or pony under the age of four may enter any jumping class and no horse or pony under the age of three may enter any ridden class.
12. Age qualifying date for rider – 1<sup>st</sup> January in the current year.
13. The judges ruling on any matter in the competition is final.
14. Distribution of rosettes at the shows will be 1<sup>st</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup>. Subject to the number of entries in the class.
15. WRC reserves the right to alter and amend this schedule and amalgamate or divide classes at the discretion of the Committee.
16. **Insurance Regulations – No child under the age of 4 years on 1<sup>st</sup> January in the current year may compete, ride or handle any horse or pony at any Wilmslow Riding Club event.**

## **WELFARE AND CONDUCT POLICY**

Wilmslow Riding Club is affiliated to the British Horse Society whose declared aims are to “Improve the quality of life for every horse”. The aims of the Riding Club’s movement are “To assist and encourage those interested in the horse and equitation, to improve and maintain the standard of riding and horsemanship and to seek to preserve and develop riding facilities”.

To these ends, WRC provides a training programme as well as support and advice from a regional Horse Welfare Advisor and a Club Training Officer. In pursuance of these aims therefore, the following will not be tolerated from any individual attending any Club activities, whether or not such person is a member:

1. Misuse of the whip, bit, spurs or other tack.
2. Use of any horse/pony which is sick, lame or in any way unfit for the task to be undertaken.
3. Any treatment of a horse/pony which can reasonably be regarded as abuse.
4. Any conduct which may be construed as bringing the Riding Club’s movement into disrepute or which displays dissent or incivility to any Club official.
5. Breach of any general WRC rules or rules specifically relevant to any particular show, event or other Club activities.

In the event of any breach of the above:

- a) Any Committee member or Club official may give informal advice which must be heeded. In all cases, the nominated Chief Steward is also empowered:
- b) To give an official verbal warning (to be stated as such) which will be recorded by the Club Secretary.
- c) To give an official written warning which will likewise be so recorded. In the case of serious or repeated breach, formal action may be taken by the Ground Jury or the Club Committee, which may result in any individual being reprimanded, suspended or debarred from Club activities and/or from its showgrounds. In such cases, the individual will be given the opportunity to put his/her case in person or writing but the decision of the Ground Jury/Committee will be final and binding.

In the case of Club members, the member may be invited by letter to resign from the Club within a specified time. In default of such resignation then both the full Committee and the member in question shall be given at least 14 days prior notice in writing of a Disciplinary Meeting. If two thirds of the Committee members present at such meeting shall then vote for his/her expulsion, the member shall thereupon cease to be a member of the Club for a period entirely at the discretion of the Committee whose decision will be final and binding.

The Committee reserves the right, at its own discretion, to publish in the Club periodic newsletters, the results of any matters so recorded.

## **HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY FOR WILMSLOW RIDING CLUB EVENTS.**

1. The Organiser has the overall responsibility for Health & Safety.
2. The event is organised in accordance with Health & Safety Legislation and all who have (to any extent) control of premises or site at the event are responsible for ensuring that:
  - a) Everything reasonably practicable is done to ensure the health and safety and welfare of those attending the event.
  - b) They conduct themselves so that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk.
  - c) Access and egress from the site is safe.
3. Emergencies.
  - a) Emergency services must have access to all parts of the event site at all times and members of the public must not park vehicles so as to obstruct access.
  - b) First Aid points are clearly marked.
  - c) In the case of an emergency, members of the public should contact the nearest official or dial 999 on the nearest telephone. A telephone is located near the Secretaries Caravan.
4. Horses can easily be frightened and can be dangerous. Members of the public are requested to keep clear from horse areas/lanes and to avoid behaviour which might alarm horses. Dogs must be kept under close control and on leads.
