THIS IS TO ENCOURAGE YOUNG RIDERS TO COME OFF THE LEAD REIN TO COMPETE.

There are qualifying classes for STARS, members only, and Trailblazers, open to members and non-members. Please see notice board for further details.

Classes may be split or amalgamated according to the number of entries.

Stallions/Colts - See WRC Rule 5 on page 37.

- 6. IMPROVERS JUMPING 50cm Horses exceeding 148cm. 10 fences, no fillers

Trailblazer qualifiers 60cm, 70cm, 80cm, 90cm & 1m (April, May, June qualify for 2023, September for 2024)

- 7. PRE NOVICE JUMPING 60cm Pony not to exceed 148cm.
- 8. PRE NOVICE JUMPING 60cm Horse to exceed 148cm.
- 9. NOVICE JUMPING 70cm Pony not to exceed 148cm.
- 10. NOVICE JUMPING 70cm Horse to exceed 148cm.
- 11. INTERMEDIATE JUMPING 80cm Horse/Ponies any height. Riders any age.
- 12. SMALL OPEN JUMPING 90cm Horses/ponies any height. Riders any age.

Classes 11 to 13 may be split if sufficient entries at the discretion of the judge.

NOTES

- Class 1 Junior riders must stay on the lead rein for all other classes entered and remain on the lead rein at all times. Exception - Classes 2 TOTS JUMPING, 45 TINY TOTS RIDDEN EQUITATION, 46 TOTS RIDDEN EQUITATION and 54 TOTS INTRO WORKING HUNTER.
- 2. Riders entered in Class 2 may only enter Class 3 without assistance at the same show.
- 3. Horses/ponies may only enter four jumping classes at a show, can be any combination of working hunter and show jumping up to a maximum of 3 in one ring. Pairs and Clear Round (1 round only) are exempt.
- 4. Riders can only compete in consecutive height classes, with the exception of class 4 Pairs.
- 5. In classes 5 to 10 horses and ponies will jump together but will be placed separately.
- 6. Classes 5 to 13 will be judged as WRC Single Phase all fences to be jumped unless eliminated. The course will be timed from fence 7 onwards. Places will be awarded: clear first section, fastest timed section faults in the first section, fastest timed section.
- Whips must be to current standards no greater than 75cm or less than 45cm in length, unweighted baton style with a flat surface, and used in accordance with British Riding Clubs 2023 rules.



 Winners may continue to enter as Novice for the remainder of the season and points will be
 accrued for the annual trophy.
- 2. The first and second placings in all Working Hunter classes will ride off at the end of the day for the Champion and Reserve Working Hunter of the Day who will receive points, to be accrued throughout the season, for the Mr Lucky trophy. A Championship League Table will be kept separately.
- 3. Competitors may enter Novice and Open if eligible.
- 4. Class 53 Junior riders on the lead rein must stay on the lead rein for all other classes entered and remain on the lead rein at all times, with the exception of Class 2 TOTS JUMPING, 45 TINY TOTS RIDDEN EQUITATION, 46 TOTS RIDDEN EQUITATION and 54 TOTS INTRO WORKING HUNTER.
- 5. Horses/ponies may only enter four jumping classes at a show, can be any combination of working hunter and show jumping. Pairs and Clear Round (1 round only) are exempt.
- 6. Whips must be to current standards no greater than 75cm or less than 45cm in length, unweighted baton style with a flat surface, and used in accordance with British Riding Clubs 2023 rules.

Class 1 - Junior Novice Plus

Riders not to have attained their 18th birthday on 1st January in the current year. Combination not to have completed a Cross Country/Horse Trials (One Day Event) while representing a Riding Club or Pony Club, nor to have completed a BE Horse Trials at a level greater than BE100. **Approximately 80cm - 90cm in height.**

Class 2 - Senior Novice Plus

Riders 18 and over on the 1st of January in the current year. Combination and heights as for Class 1.

Class 3 - Pairs (am) - Juniors and Seniors may compete together.

Competitors in this class may only compete in Novice and Intermediate including Open sections as well. May not compete in pairs starters class 6 as a combination. Not starters class 7A or 7B. **Approximately 70cm - 80cm in height.**

This class will be held over the Novice course. There will be a 'dressing' fence - pairs will jump the dressing fence side by side. The distance between the pairs will incur penalties (5, 10, 15 or 20) if the pair is not together.

Class 4B - Senior Novice

Class 5A - Junior Open Novice

Riders not to have attained their 18th birthday on 1st January in the current year.

This class is aimed at Riders not eligible for class 4A, but who still wish to compete at that level.

Class 5B - Senior Open Novice

Class 6 - Pairs (Starters). Juniors and Seniors may compete together.

Cross Country Challenge

To be held at The Club Field, Castle Hill Farm, Mill Lane, Ashley Sunday, 11th June 2023 - Start 10am - sponsored by Erika Green Equine

This competition will consist of one round of Show Jumps followed immediately by a round of Cross Country. Any Show Jumping and Cross Country penalties will be combined to give the total penalties, with the winner being the competitor with the fewest penalties. Both rounds will be timed and in the event of a tie for any place the Competitor with the fastest Show Jumping round will be placed highest.

Please note: Competitors may only enter one individual class plus pairs. (British Riding Club Rule).

The Cross Country section in all classes, apart from the Starters Pairs, will be a **Qualifier for the Eland Lodge.com Hunter Trials Championship 2023.** This includes Starters. If eliminated in the Show Jumping phase and safe to continue to the Cross Country you will still be eligible to qualify for Eland Lodge.

Class 1 - Junior Novice Plus

Riders not to have attained 18th birthday on 1st January in the current year.

Combination not to have completed a Cross Country/Horse Trials (One Day Event) while representing a Riding Club or Pony Club, nor to have completed a BE Horse Trials at a level greater than BE100. Show Jumping 90cm, Cross Country approximately 80cm - 90m in height.

Class 2 - Senior Novice Plus

Riders 18 and over on 1st January in the current year. Otherwise as Class 1.

Class 3 - Pairs Novice - Junior and Senior may compete together.

As well as competing in this class competitors may only enter Novice and Intermediate sections, including the Open sections. May not compete in pairs starters class 6 as a combination or in Starters classes 7A/B or 8A/B. **Show Jumping 70cm. Cross Country approximately 70cm - 80cm in height.** Eligibility as for Novice and Intermediate depending on ability. Please see notes on page 31 for more information.

Class 4A - Junior Novice

Riders not to have attained their 18th birthday on 1st January in the current year. Combination not to have been placed in any Cross Country/Horse Trials (One Day Event) other than Novice or Starters and not to have won Novice. Combination not to have completed a Cross Country/Horse Trials (One Day Event) while representing a Riding Club or Pony Club, nor to have completed a BE Horse Trials at a level greater than BE80. Show Jumping 70cm, Cross Country approximately 70cm-80cm in height.

Class 4B - Senior Novice

Riders 18 and over on 1st January in the current year. Otherwise as Class 4A.

Class 5A - Junior Open Novice

Riders not to have attained 18th birthday on 1st January in the current year.

This class is aimed at Riders not eligible for class 4A, but who still wish to compete at that level.

Class 5B - Senior Open Novice

Cross Country Challenge/Show Jumping - Notes for Pairs Competitors

- 1. Both riders enter the Show Jumping ring together.
- 2. The second rider stands behind the pole (pen).
- When the buzzer sounds the first rider will commence their round, when finished they will proceed to the pen and when behind the pole the second rider may commence their round.
- 4. If the first rider gets eliminated the second rider may finish the first rider's round then continue on to complete their own round. If the second rider is eliminated, the pair is eliminated.

The following for Cross Country Challenge Pairs only:

- 5. When the second rider has completed their round the pair will proceed immediately to the cross country course.
- 6. This is not a speed class but the round is timed from the start of the first rider to the end of the second rider. This time is only used in the case of equality in the cross country phase, ie: combination of faults and time.
- 7. Pair may not continue onto the cross country course if either rider, individually, incurs 24 faults in the show jumping, gets eliminated or (in the opinion of the judge) is not safe.
- 8. In that case an individual rider, able to continue, may do so immediately H/C and may qualify for the Eland Lodge.com Hunter Trials Championship 2023.
- 9. There will not be any fillers in the starters classes.
- 10. All the usual rules apply to the cross country phase. ie: timed from the first rider to commence until the last rider finishes, open flagged (jump between the red and white flags) etc.

Notes for Dressage and Combined Training

- Requests for copies of tests at £1 each to the Dressage Secretary. WRC lead rein/first ridden test may be down loaded from the website.
- 2. Annual trophies for Junior Dressage, Senior Dressage, Junior, Senior Combined Training members only, on a points system at the Committee's discretion. Must be the same combination of Horse/Pony and rider. A minimum of two competitions attended.
- In WRC classes, a combination of Rider/Horse or Pony may only enter classes at their appropriate level. Entries may be accepted Hors Concours at the discretion of the Organiser, numbers permitting.
- 4. Juniors not to have attained their 18th birthday on the 1st January in the current year.
- 5. All tests are current British Dressage tests, or WRC Dressage tests.
- 6. Stallions must be bitted at all times and wear a Bridle Tag. Stallions must be ridden and handled by an adult (18 years or over on 1st January in the current year).
- 7. WRC and British Dressage rules apply, see page 37.
- 8. If your times are not on the website, please contact the organiser.
- 9. Competitors in the Intro test may also compete in the Prelim classes. Combination not to have previously competed in Novice sections or above.
- 10. Competitors may enter both pure Dressage and Combined Training. This will be judged as two separate classes. Two sets of rosettes. The Dressage test will only be ridden once.
- 11. Seniors and Juniors will be split if there are sufficient entries.
- 12. Any Competitor having a fall may not remount or continue until they have been checked by a First Aider.
- 13. There will be a limit on the number of classes a horse may enter irrespective of the rider.
- 14. When entering more than one dressage and or combined training class we cannot guarantee you will be able to complete all your dressage tests before show jumping.
- 15. Whips Combined Training Only: must be to current standards no greater than 75cm or less than 45cm in length, unweighted baton style with a flat surface, and used in accordance with British Riding Clubs 2023 rules.

WELFARE & CONDUCT POLICY

Wilmslow Riding Club is affiliated to the British Horse Society whose declared aims are to 'Improve the quality of life for every horse'. The aims of the Riding Clubs' movement are 'To assist and encourage those interested in the horse and equitation, to improve and maintain the standard of riding and horsemanship and to seek to preserve and develop riding facilities'.

To these ends, WRC provides a training programme as well as support and advice from a regional Horse Welfare Advisor and a Club Training Officer. In pursuance of these aims therefore, the following will not be tolerated from any individual attending any Club activities, whether or not such person is a member:

- 1. Misuse of the whip, bit, spurs or other tack.
- 2. Use of any horse/pony which is sick, lame or in any way unfit for the task to be undertaken.
- 3. Any treatment of a horse/pony which can reasonably be regarded as abuse.
- 4. Any conduct which may be construed as bringing the Riding Clubs' movement into disrepute or which displays dissent or incivility to any Club official.
- Breach of any general WRC rules or rules specifically relevant to any particular shows, events or other Club activities.

In the event of any breach of the above:

a) any Committee member or Club official may give informal advice which must be heeded.

In all cases, the nominated Chief Steward is also empowered:

- to give an official verbal warning (to be then stated as such) which will be recorded by the Club Secretary.
- c) to give an official written warning which will likewise be so recorded. In the case of serious or repeated breach, formal action may be taken by the Ground Jury or the Club Committee, which may result in any individual being reprimanded, suspended or debarred from Club activities and/or from its show grounds. In such cases, the individual will be given an opportunity to put his/her case in person or writing but the decision of the Ground Jury/ Committee will be final and binding.

In the case of Club members, the member may be invited by letter to resign from the Club within a specified time. In default of such resignation then both the full Committee and the member in question shall be given at least 14 days' prior notice in writing of a Disciplinary Meeting. If two thirds of the Committee members present at such meeting shall then vote for his/her expulsion, the member shall thereupon cease to be a member of the Club for a period entirely at the discretion of the Committee whose decision will be final and binding.

The Committee reserves the right, at its own discretion, to publish in the Club periodic newsletters, the results of any matters so recorded.

The Welfare Policy of WRC must be adhered to at all times and it is the responsibility of all competitors and owners to ensure that the welfare of their horse(s) or pony(ies) is given priority at all times on the showground.

WRC RULES

- At all WRC events, everybody mounted must wear protective headgear conforming to BRC current standards at all times. These hats must be worn with the harness properly adjusted and fastened.
- No rider will be permitted to enter any class unless correctly dressed, including hard hat, suitable footwear, jacket and jodhpurs.
- 3. It is the responsibility of each competitor to enter the ring when required for each class. If for any reason a competitor is unable to enter the ring when called, it is the responsibility of the competitor to inform the ring steward of the circumstances. Competitors leaving the ring whilst the class is in progress will only be allowed back at the discretion of the judge. Only real emergencies will be accepted as reason for disrupting the class.
- Show entry fees will only be refunded in the event of a class being cancelled or upon receipt
 of medical or veterinary evidence.
- 5. All stallions and colts must be handled or ridden by an adult (18 years and over on 1st January in the current year). All stallions 2 years and over must be bitted. Stallions must wear a bridle tag. Please declare on Entry Form.
- 6. All events and classes are run under the guidance of the appropriate discipline's rules.
- 7. Any objection must be made in writing to the Secretary within 30 minutes of the end of the class together with £20. This will be returned if the objection is upheld.
- 8. Riders must keep to the designated working-in areas and pedestrians to the designated walk ways. Horses are not allowed in the vicinity of the Secretary's office.
 No galloping, offenders will be required to leave the field and no refund will be made.
- 9. No horse or pony under the age of four may enter any jumping class and no horse or pony under the age of three may enter any ridden class.
- 10. Age qualifying date for rider -1st January in the current year.
- 11. The judge's ruling on any matter in competition is final.
- 12. Distribution of rosettes at shows will be 1st to 6th, subject to number of entries in the class.
- 13. WRC reserves the right to alter and amend this schedule and amalgamate or divide classes, and refuse entries or membership at the discretion of the Committee.
- 14. Junior competitors entering classes on the lead rein may not enter any other classes off the lead rein and must remain on the lead rein at all times, with the exception of Classes 2, 45, 46 and 54.
- 15. Competitors having a fall at any WRC event must be checked by a First Aider before remounting and continuing. This includes all Dressage, Showing and Jumping Classes. In any case it is recommended that they are checked by a First Aider before leaving the Show ground.
- 16. Points/Trophies will be awarded to members where they have attended two shows or more and have fulfilled their duty day obligations.
- 17. Whips: must be to current standards no greater than 75cm or less than 45cm in length, unweighted baton style with a flat surface, and used in accordance with British Riding Clubs 2023 rules.
- 18. Whiskers: It is not permitted to remove a horse's whiskers.
